

Modular Combinations for the Designated Equine Certificates

The following Equine modules are available, either as free-standing modules or as part of the Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice and the designated Equine Certificates.

All of the following modules are worth 10 credits or 100 notional study hours.

Other modules that can also be taken as part of the designated Equine Certificates are referred to in the specific designated certificate modular combinations below.

There are six designated Equine certificates for the Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice. Candidates wishing to work towards a particular designated certificate will be required to take the following combinations of modules:

For all Equine Certificates, candidates must take the A-FAVP.1 module: Foundations of Advanced Veterinary Practice and the B-EP.3 module in Equine Practice.

Candidates who have achieved 20 credits from a combination of the A-Professional Key Skills Module.1 (A-PKS.1) **AND** the B-Clinical Key Skills.0 (B-CKS.0) module may use these towards their designated certificate in place of the A-Foundations of Advanced Veterinary Practice (A-FAVP.1) module **AND** the “Free Choice” module.

The remaining C modules may be taken in the following combinations:

Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice (Equine Practice)

- **Any three** of the C-Equine modules (plus a free choice module)

Or

- **Any two** of the C-Equine modules and an additional C-module of the candidate's choice from the following:

Plus a free choice module (the candidate may choose a B or C module from any discipline)

Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice (Equine Stud Medicine)

Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice (Equine Dentistry)

Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice (Equine Lameness Diagnosis and Therapeutics)

All three of the following modules must be taken

Plus a free choice module (the candidate may choose a B or C module from any discipline).

Candidates may wish to choose C-VDI.5 but this is not compulsory.
