The deadline for making a nomination is **5pm on Friday 27 January 2023**.

Nominations for the International Award may be made by MsRCVS and RVNs as well as laypeople, **excluding current members of RCVS Council and VN Council**. Nominees for the award do not need to be MsRCVS or RVNs, nor do they necessarily need similar or equivalent status if they live and work outside the UK. Supporting statements can be supplied by non-veterinary professionals.
