RCVS STUDENT COMMUNITY AWARD NOMINATION FORM

Please note that any information supplied in this application will form the basis of a citation for the successful nominees to be read by the President of the RCVS at Royal College Day in July 2023.

The deadline for making a nomination is 5pm on Friday 27 January 2023.

Nominations for the RCVS Student Community Award can be made by anyone – they do not need to be an MRCVS or RVN – **although current RCVS Council and VN Council members are excluded**. Nominees for the award can be any student who is enrolled on an RCVS-approved veterinary or veterinary nursing course, or studying for a relevant postgraduate veterinary/veterinary nursing qualification.

Relevant qualifications of nominee: these will be used on the certificate in the event that the nomination is successful.		
Nominee's education/ training institution and/ or qualification being studied for:		
This is a new award to be bestowed for the first time in 2021, and will recognise a veterinary or veterinary nursing student who has made a real effort to support their fellow students and the wider veterinary/veterinary nursing school community. It may also reward someone who has contributed to the wider local community within which the academic environment is based.		
A wide range of different types of activity could be recognised by the award, for example, a specific initiative that the student has developed; personal support they have given over a sustained period (please do not include personal information about recipients of support that may be confidential); a demonstrable civic awareness in the way they have conducted themselves in student politics; an outreach programme to the local community; contribution to the governance of the student body etc.		
In no more than 350 words please explain why you think your nominee is deserving of the RCVS Student Community Award.		



Any other relevant information: in no more than 250 words please provide us with any further information you feel may support this application – this could include, for example, anecdotes about your interactions with the individual or information about their hobbies, interests or personal life.

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Supporters' statements

Nomination applications require two supporting statements of **no more than 250 words** which may be from an MRCVS, RVN or layperson. At least one of these must be someone who is not a close working colleague of the person nominated, to demonstrate breadth of support. The supporting statements should be **no longer than 250 words** and should include:

•	The name of the nominee
•	The award/honour for which they are being proposed
•	Supporter's job title
•	Relationship to the nominee
•	Information about why they believe the nominee is deserving of the RCVS Student Community Award
•	Date
