


Student veterinary nurse enrolments with the RCVS







Figure 1. Breakdown of members by category of registerable qualification





Figure 2. Breakdown of principal RCVS membership categories






Figure 4. Listed and registered veterinary nurses by age





Figure 5. Numbers of veterinary surgeons/veterinary nurses in the UK









Figure 8. Trends in registration of veterinary surgeons









CertAVP enrolments







Complaints received vs number of vets/nurses




Cost of DC cases vs Protocol cases




Figure 10. Number of complaints raised about veterinary surgeons and registered veterinary nurses





Figure 11. Number and category of complaints and written requests for advice received

Figure 12. Average time (in weeks) for each stage of the complaints process




